




## Hotel MARRIOTT\*\*\*\*\*, Vienna






## Hotel BRISTOL \*\*\*\*\* Vienna








## Vienna

Walk in the footsteps of the Habsburgs; visit the splendid baroque Schönbrunn and Belvedere Palaces; stroll along the magnificent Ring Boulevard and get an up-close look at the heart of the vast former Habsburg Empire: the Imperial Palace. Get a sense of the luster and glory of the old empire by visiting St. Stephen's Cathedral, the Spanish Riding School, the Giant Ferris Wheel at the Prater, and the sarcophagi in the Imperial Vault.





## Vienna Ringstrasse

Vienna's Ringstrasse is 5.3 kilometers long – long enough to provide space for numerous monumental buildings, most of which were built during the period of Historicism from the 1860s to the 1890s. Today, the buildings that stand there – from the Vienna State Opera House to the Museum of Fine Arts – are among the most important sights in the city of Vienna. On May 1, 1865, Emperor Franz opened the Vienna Ringstrasse with a grand ceremony.





## Horse-Drawn Carriage

Discover Vienna during a romantic horse-drawn carriage ride, and let yourself be enchanted by the historical buildings which supply so much unique charm to Austria's capital. You will get to know Vienna's picturesque scenery and its magnificent buildings in a comfortable traditional coach during a city tour lasting 20 or 40 minutes – the choice is yours. Let yourself be transported to earlier times, and enjoy the unforgettable atmosphere of a horse-drawn carriage as it was during imperial times.






## Lunch @ Zwölf Apostelkeller

Enjoy the historic ambience of the year 1339 and the diverse of Viennese cuisine based on old recipes, and let yourself be enchanted by our selected quality wines. We serve original "Wiener Schnitzel Kaiser Art" and "Tafelspitz" (traditional boiled beef). The classic "Fiakergulasch" (beef goulash with sausages and fried egg) is one of our specialties and tastes great with a good beer. Viennese cuisine is also well known for its tasty desserts. We offer a variety of sweets and deserts such as "Apfel,- und Topenstrudel" (apple and cheese curd strudel) or "Kaiserschmarren" (shredded pancake).





## Schönbrunn Palace

The splendid baroque building which dates back to the 17th century and the adjoining extensive park are two of the most visited sights in town. A tour of Schönbrunn's grandiose rooms provides a look into the world of the Austrian imperial house. It was here that Franz Joseph, who married the enchanting Sissi and ruled from 1848 to 1916, was born. Today the Palace is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.





## Coffee break & Apple Strudel Show @ Café Residenz

The Café Restaurant Residenz is a classical Viennese coffee house located in the Eastern wing of Schloss Schönbrunn. There, in the demonstration bakery, every hour, a professional pastry chef bakes original Viennese apple strudel. Visitors not only learn how this divine Viennese dessert is made, but are also given the original Viennese apple strudel recipe to try out for themselves at home. The mouthwatering aromas that issue forth from the bakery make it hard to resist trying a piece of freshly baked apple strudel, with coffee, at one of the small tables in the imperial bakery.





## Dinner @ Donauturm


The Danube Tower is one of the most spectacular sights in Vienna, and a prime example of modern architecture. It was constructed for the Viennese International Garden Show in 1964, and is now a listed building. In the Danube Tower, everything revolves around the Viennese cuisine, wines, and hospitality. The "Donauturm" restaurant is located on a floor 170 meters from the ground, and offers a breathtaking 360 degree outlook over the picturesque city. Relish in the classic recipes of the traditional Viennese cuisine created with a modern and light touch.



## Vienna Woods

This tour shows you the most beautiful sights of Vienna's surroundings, namely the Vienna woods with their rolling coniferous and deciduous woodlands. You will also experience numerous vineyards, and the Danube River. Driving through the Vienna woods, you will visit the Cistercian Abbey of Heiligenkreuz, and the Memorial Chapel of Mayerling. Via the romantic Helenental, you will reach the old Roman city of Baden, a popular spa town. From there, you will ride back to Vienna, eventually passing the wine-growing village of Gumpoldskirchen.






## Seegrotte

Perhaps you are more intrigued by the mysteries of water than those of land, and in that case the beautiful Seegrotte is for you. The largest underground lake in Europe, this beautiful geographical feature of the woods was once a gypsum mine, but was flooded in the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. Now, visitors have the opportunity to tour the remains of the mine or take an other-worldly boat ride across the underground lake.





## Mayerling

This hunting lodge is home to not only an incredibly important cloister of nuns, but one of the most interesting and mysterious events of the Hapsburg empire – the suicide/murder of Crown prince Rudolph and his mistress Mary Vetsera. While it is unclear what exactly did happen that night, visitors can now tour the site of “The Mayerling Incident” set against the beautiful backdrop of these amazing woods.






## Lunch @ Café Doblhoffpark

The Café Restaurant Doblhoffpark is situated right by the pond and offers its own charm in all seasons, especially to the rose blossom when a light breeze exudes the smell of roses from the nearby Rosarium. After a fresh and lovingly prepared lunch by the kitchen chef, you should definitely try the homemade flour dishes! Many products, be it food or drink, come from Lower Austrian farmers in the region: from poultry, beef, fruit juice, to the various herbs - you will taste the difference!





## Baden

Pamper yourself in the beautiful spa town of Baden. This town, which literally translates to “baths” in German, takes its name from the 13 hot springs that are around the city. Even the ancient Romans came to Baden to get away, and some of the ruins from their stays here are still visible. Another famous guest of this town is the great composer Beethoven, and you can visit his old haunts today as well.





## Shopping in Fashion Outlet Parndorf

## Dinner @ Piaristenkeller

This is a 300 year old monastery cellar with two imperial museums and a historic restaurant. Attractions of the restaurant include a visit to the wine cellar, the Emperor Franz Joseph Hat Museum, as well as the Imperial and Royal Wine Treasure Vault, before or after the meal. Hosts who wish to surprise their guests with something out of the ordinary will find the perfect opportunity to do so here.

## Spanish Riding School in Vienna

Levade, courbette and capriole are classical school jumps performed by the Lipizzaner stallions, who enchant their public at the Spanish Riding School in Vienna. The traditions of this haute école of classic equestrianism have been passed down by word of mouth for more than 400 years. Once these intelligent white stallions have completed their training, they are known as professors. These world famous horses originally from Spain are schooled in the Winter Riding School of the Hofburg Palace in a hippodrome once reserved for the imperial family.





## Shopping in Vienna

The main shopping streets are located in the city center. The great luxury brands have discovered Vienna. They present cool elegance and stylish glamour in exclusive boutiques between Kohlmarkt and Kärntner Strasse. Other famous shopping streets are the Graben, or Mariahilferstrasse: one of the longest and most lively shopping streets in Vienna. The Naschmarkt is a vegetable-and-fruit market with a lively scene everyday. For a visit, head south of the opera district.





## Lunch @ Führich

In the heart of Vienna – between the Vienna State Opera House and St. Stephen's Square – you will find the popular Restaurant Führich, located in one of the small streets of the famous Kärntner Straße. The cozy atmosphere, sunny outdoor tables, and warm meals served throughout the day attract many guests both day and night. The menu offers a great variety, including typical Viennese dishes such as "Wiener Schnitzel", "Tafelspitz" or fresh "Apfelstrudel".
